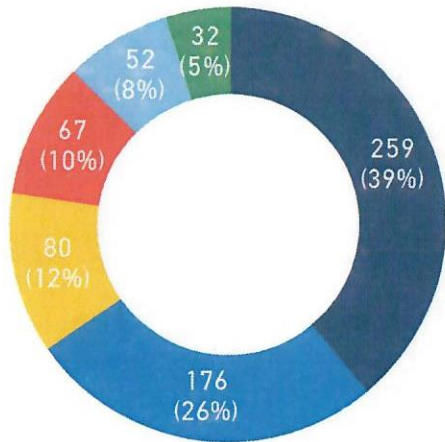

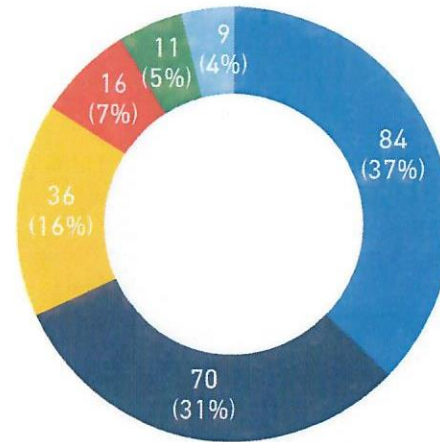

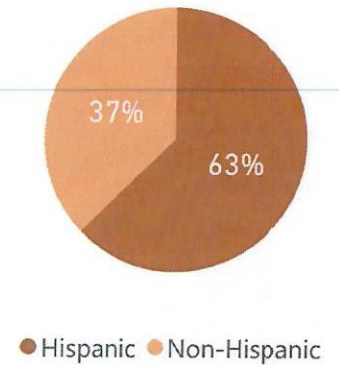

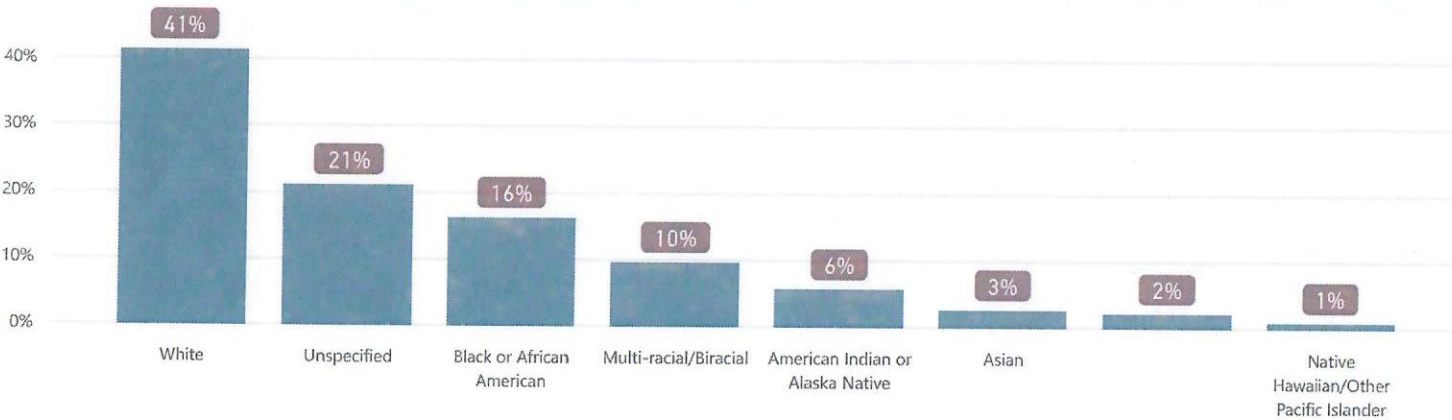
RACIAL BREAKDOWN of HEAD START PROGRAM: 2019-2020



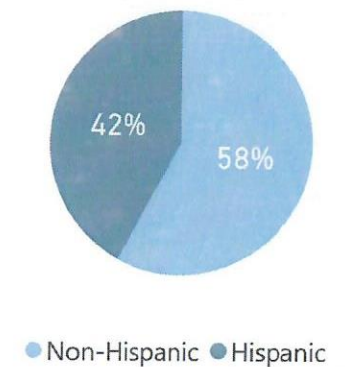
HS ETHNIC BREAKDOWN: 2019-2020



RACIAL BREAKDOWN of EARLY HEAD START PROGRAM: 2019-2020



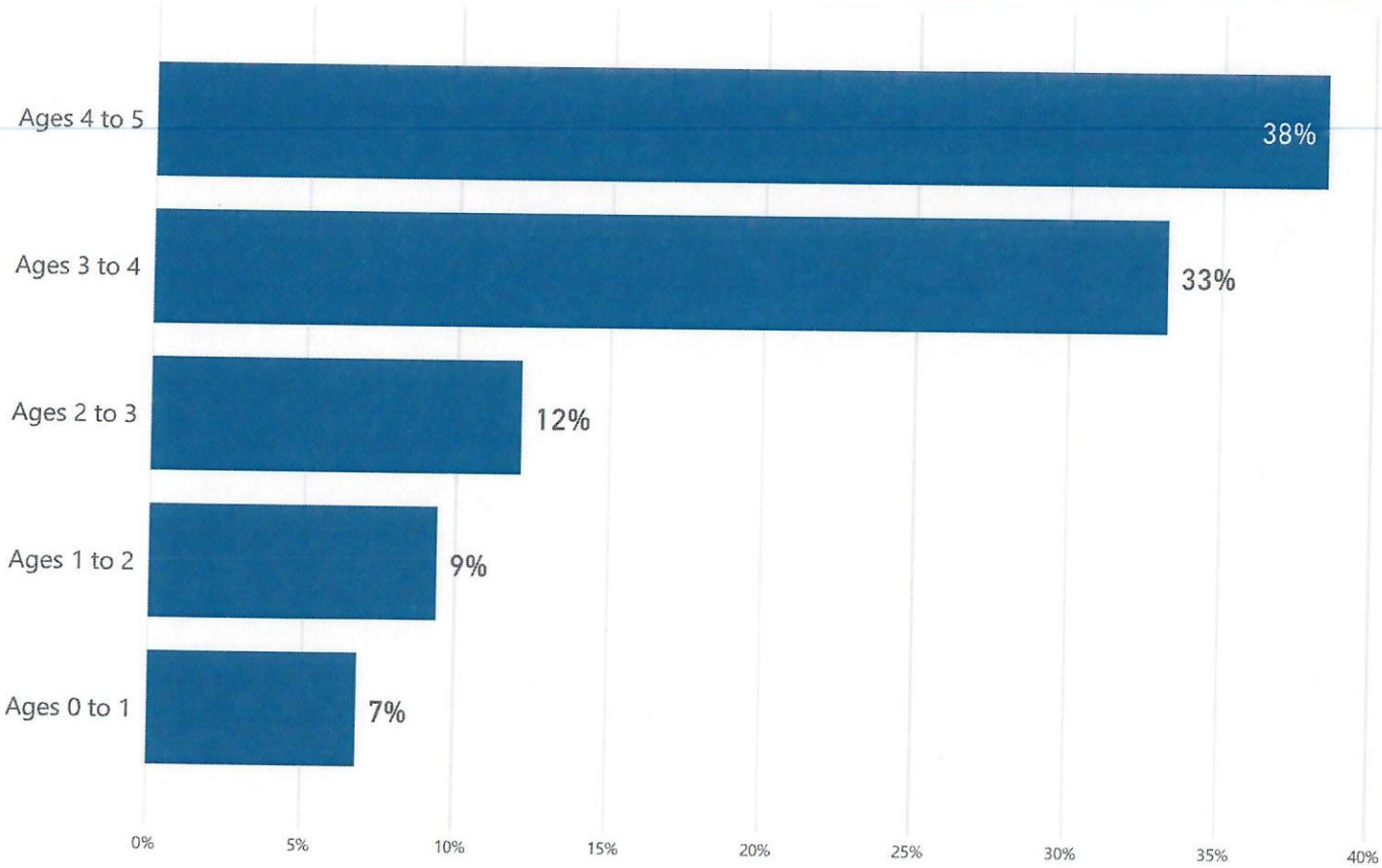
EHS ETHNIC BREAKDOWN: 2019-2020





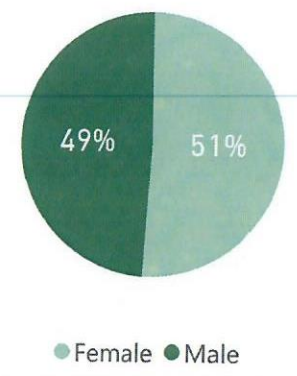

AGE AT PUBLIC SCHOOL CUT-OFF DATE (Sept. 30, 2020)

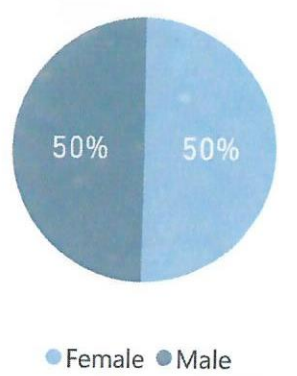


AGE/GENDER

HS GENDER BREAKDOWN: 2019-2020



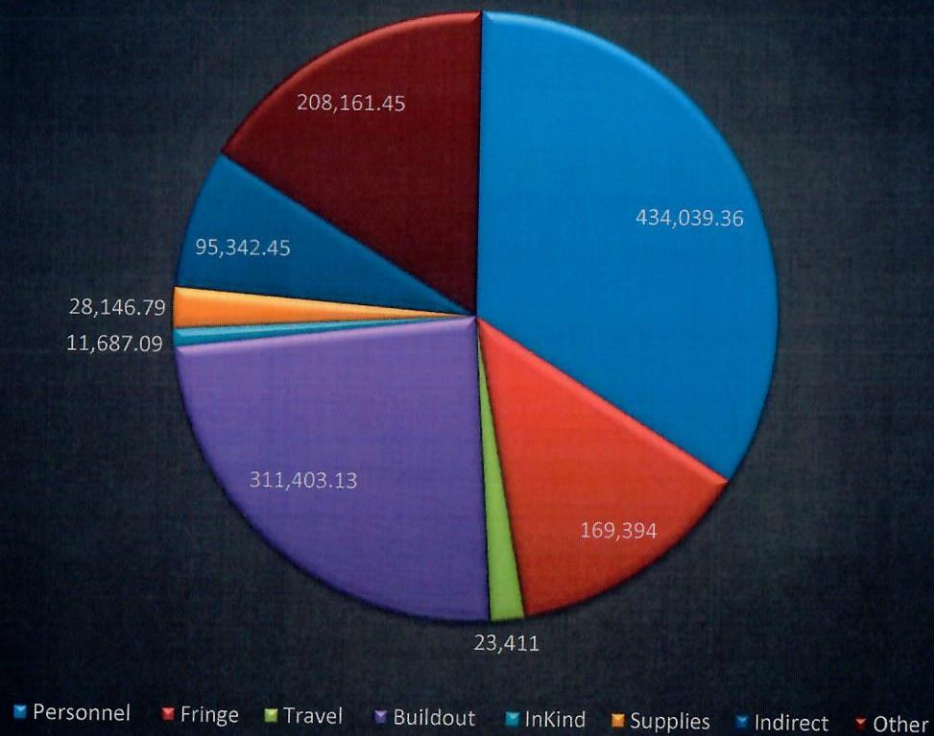
EHS GENDER BREAKDOWN: 2019-2020



Fiscal Year 2019 -2020 Funding Level for CSA Early Head Start

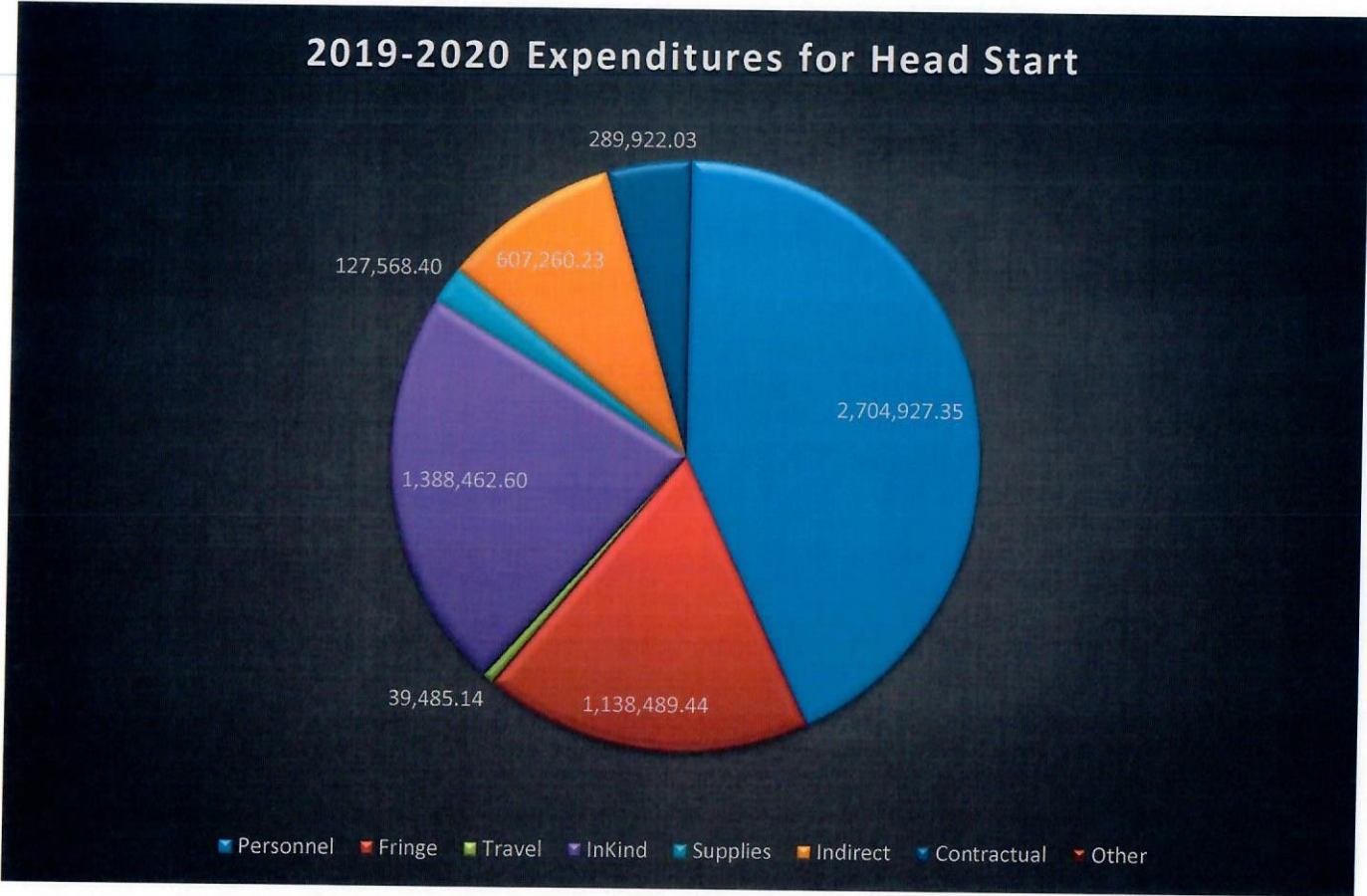

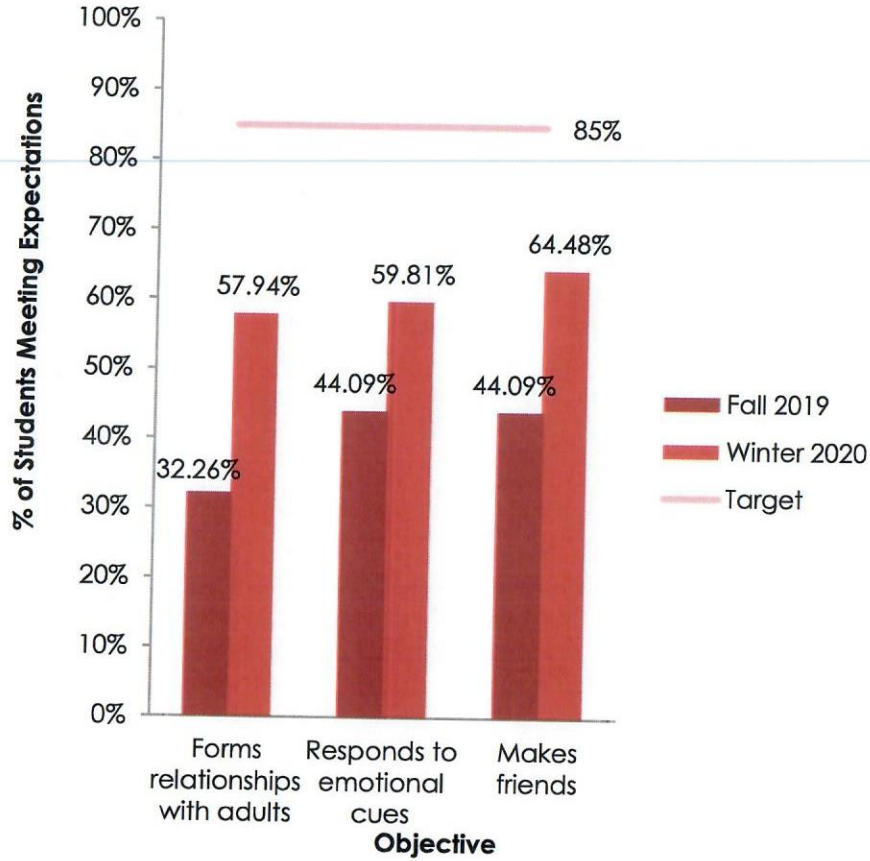
Community Services Agency utilizes Creative Curriculum, a nationally known Early Childhood curriculum. This curriculum has built-in assessments of each child's progress over the course of the school year. Following an initial screening with Brigance in Head Start or Ages and Stages Questionnaire in Early Head Start, each child is assessed 3 times a year in each learning area- including language, math, social-emotional, science, and other developmental domains. Parents participate in home visits and conferences (this year these were done both in person and virtually after March) several times a year for the purpose of discussing their child's learning progress and setting goals for future learning.



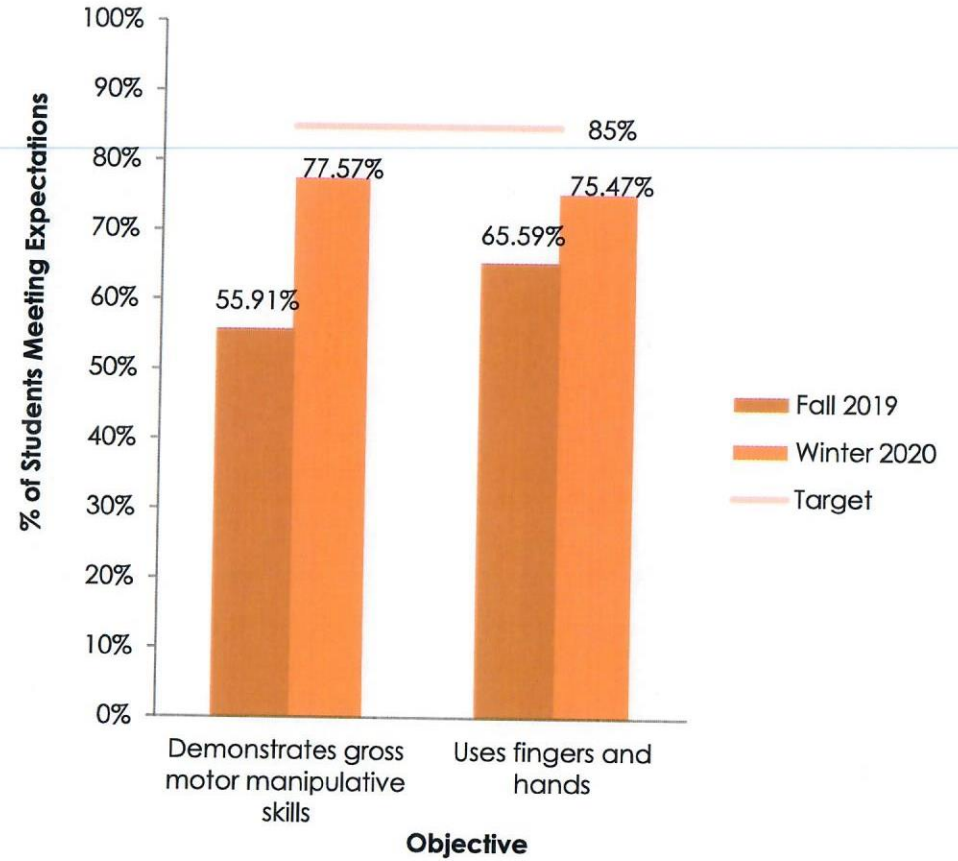
During the school year, CSA sets school readiness goals and sets up activities that are related to the program's goals. Each classroom has its own specific school readiness plan. Training and professional development are also related to school readiness goals and activities throughout the Head Start and Early Head Start programs.



Head Start School Readiness Goals 19-20 Social Emotional

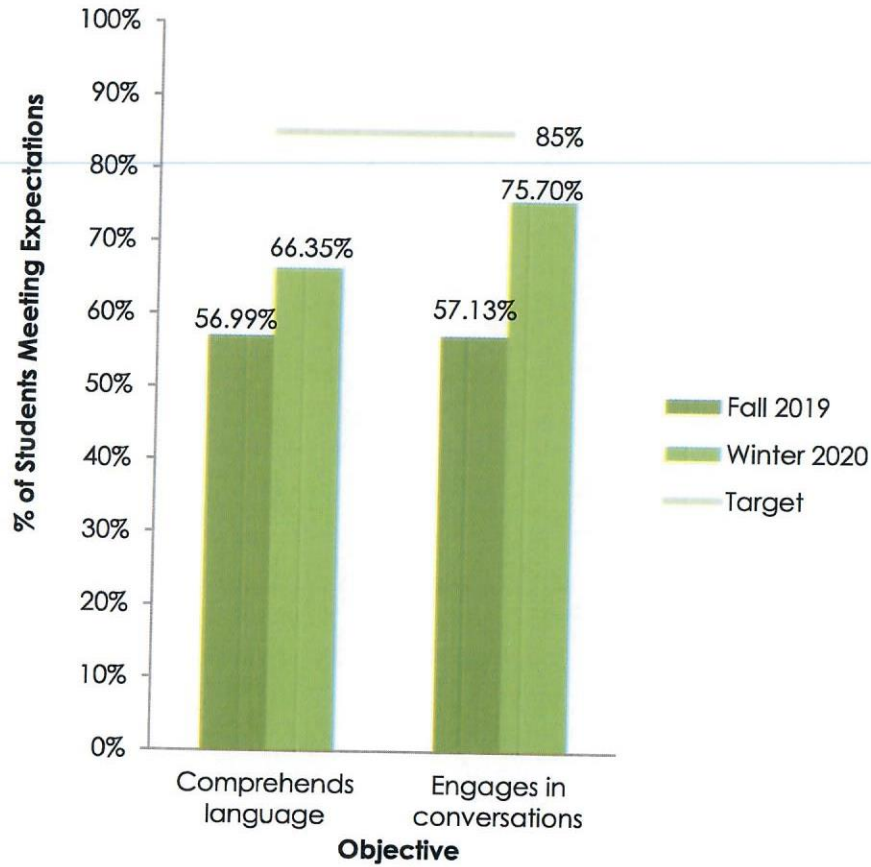


Head Start School Readiness Goals 19-20 Physical

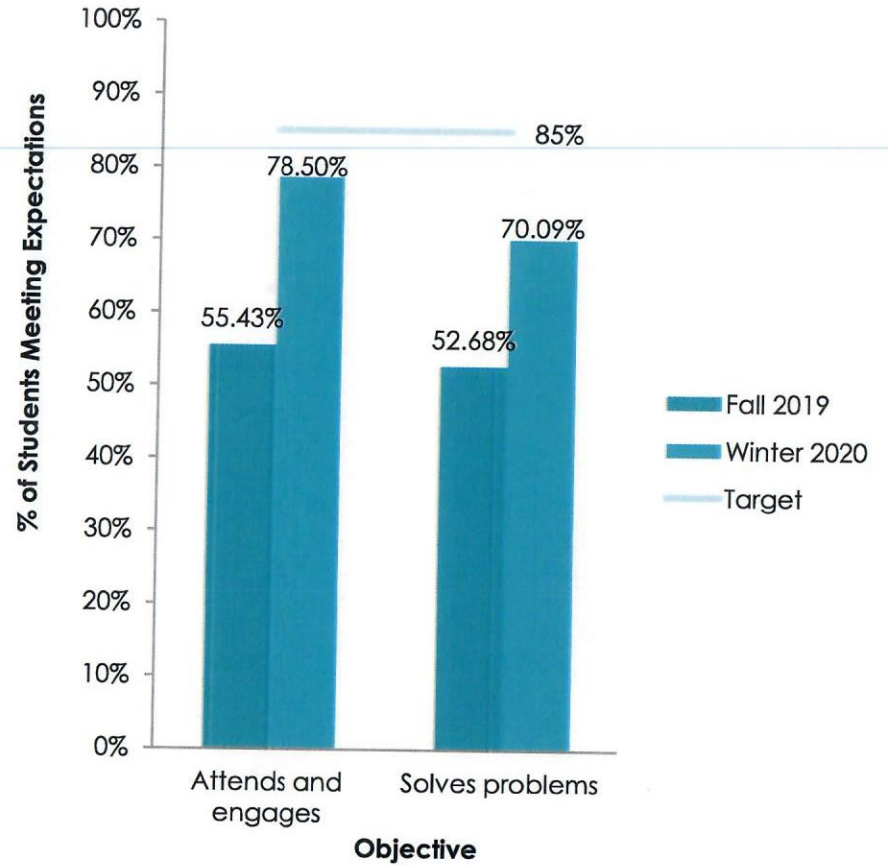




Head Start School Readiness Goals 19-20 Language

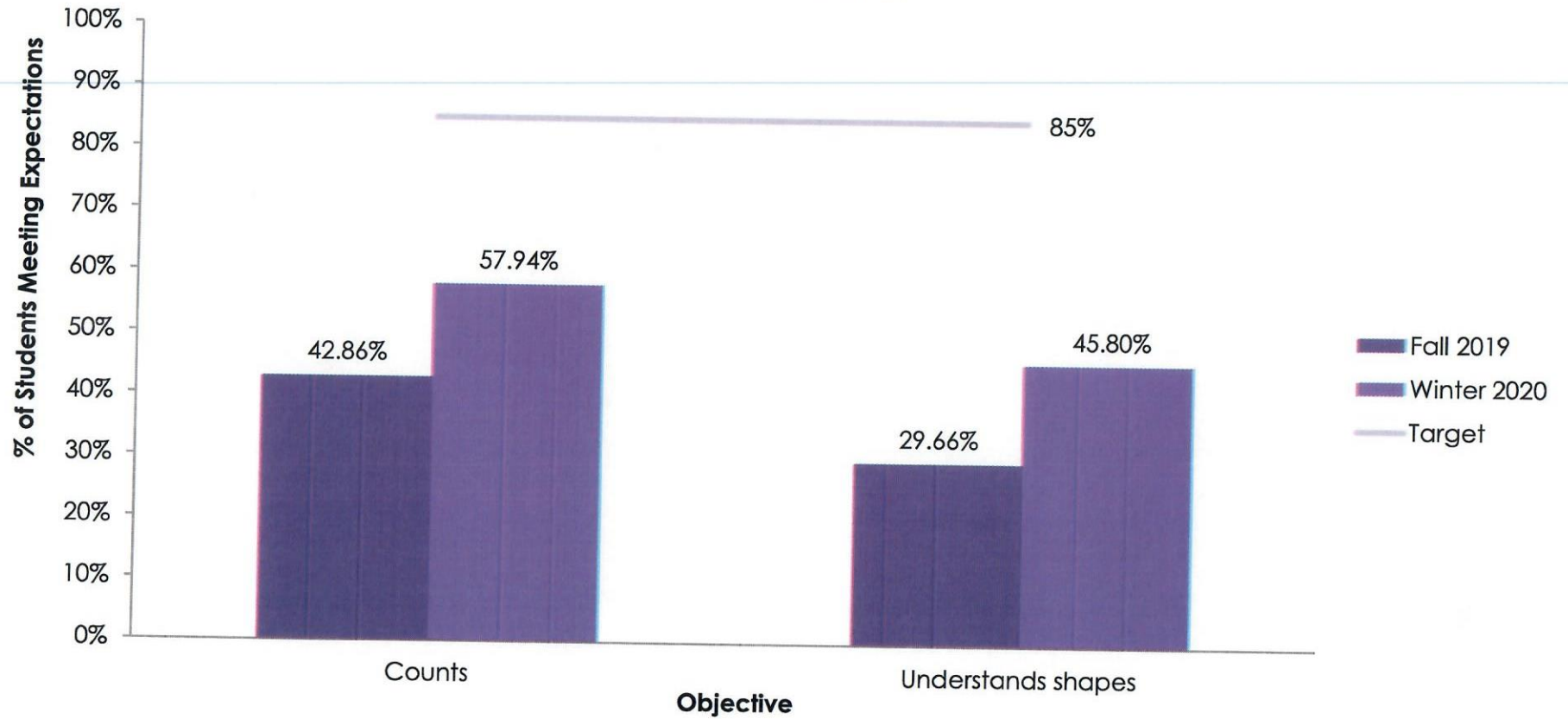


Head Start School Readiness Goals 19-20 Cognitive



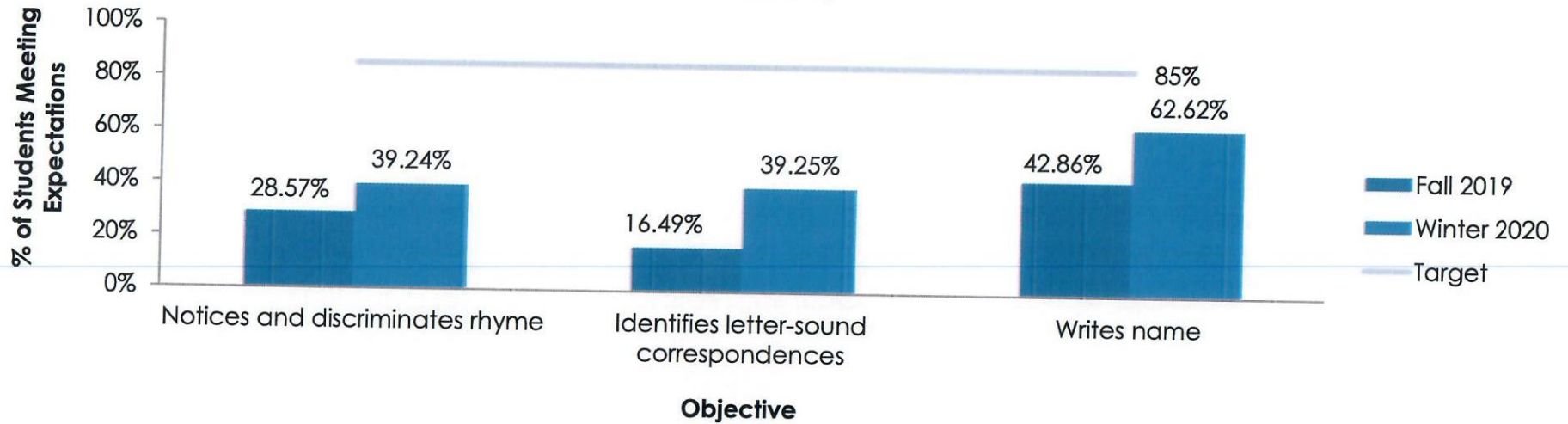


Head Start School Readiness Goals 19-20 Mathematics

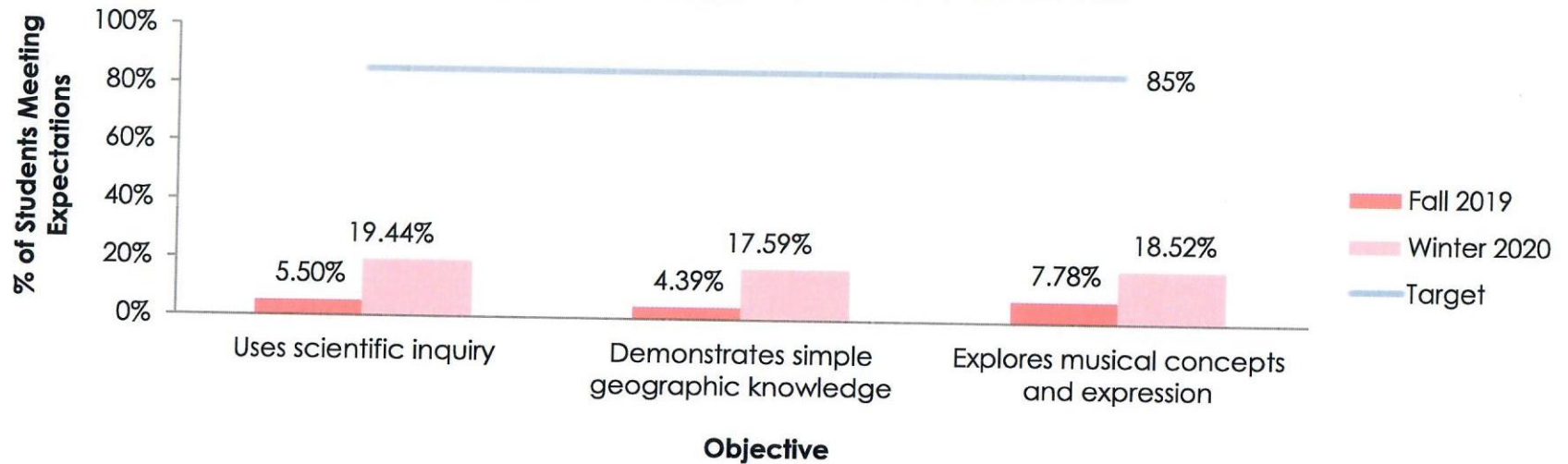




Head Start School Readiness Goals 19-20 Literacy

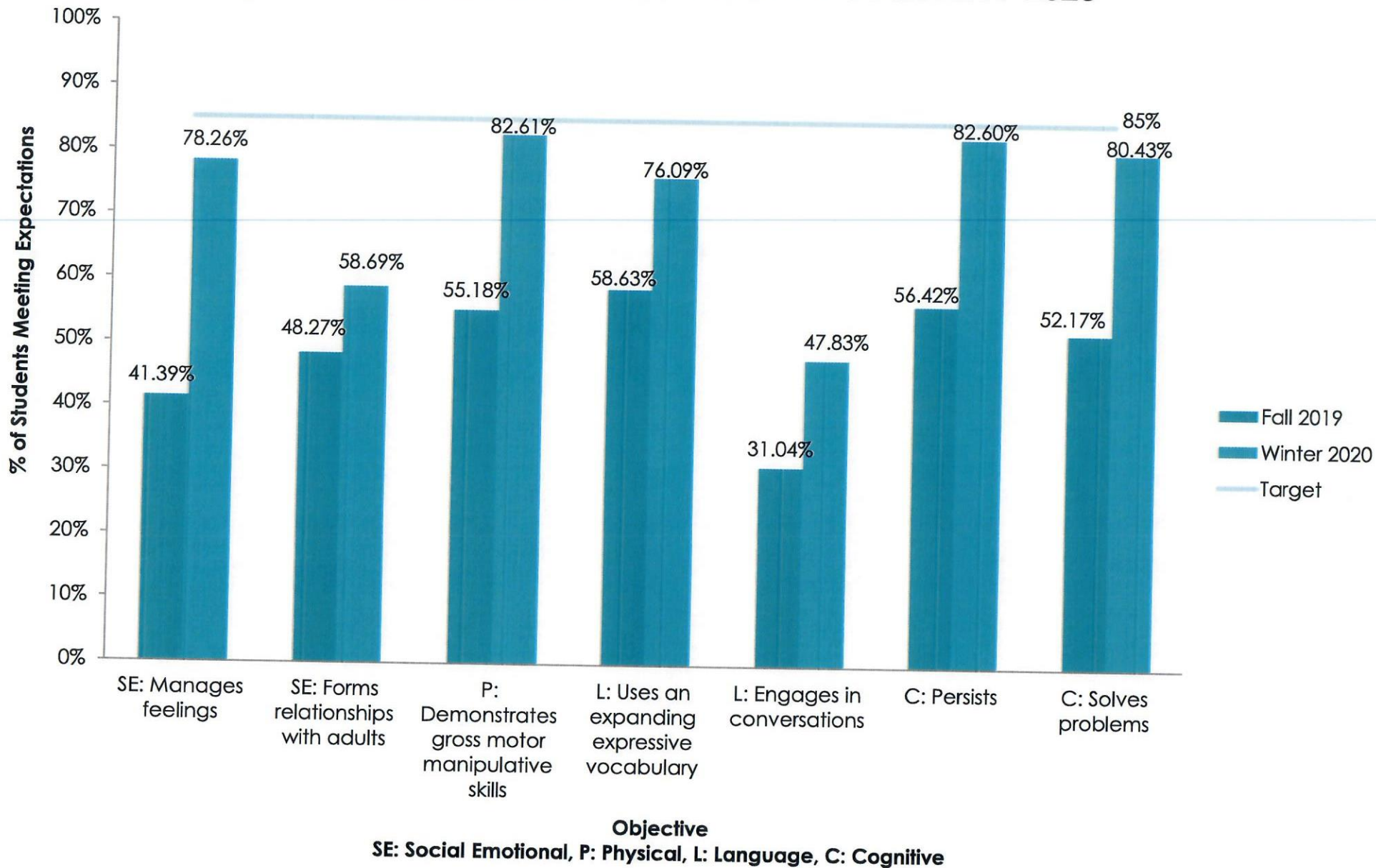

Program Quality and Outcomes– CLASS

In our overall CLASS scores, Community Services Agency Head Start scored higher than the national average in the Emotional Support and Classroom Organization domains.

The Pre-K Classroom Assessment Scoring System (CLASS) tool assesses 3 domains and 10 dimensions of teacher-child interactions and measures the interactions on a seven point scale. Our program completes the CLASS assessment two times a year, during the Fall and the Spring and coaching is done in between the two assessment points. This upcoming year Early Head Start classrooms will also get an infant-toddler CLASS assessment. For the 2019-2020 program year, you will see our Fall 2019 CLASS assessment data. There was no Spring CLASS data due to the shutdowns.



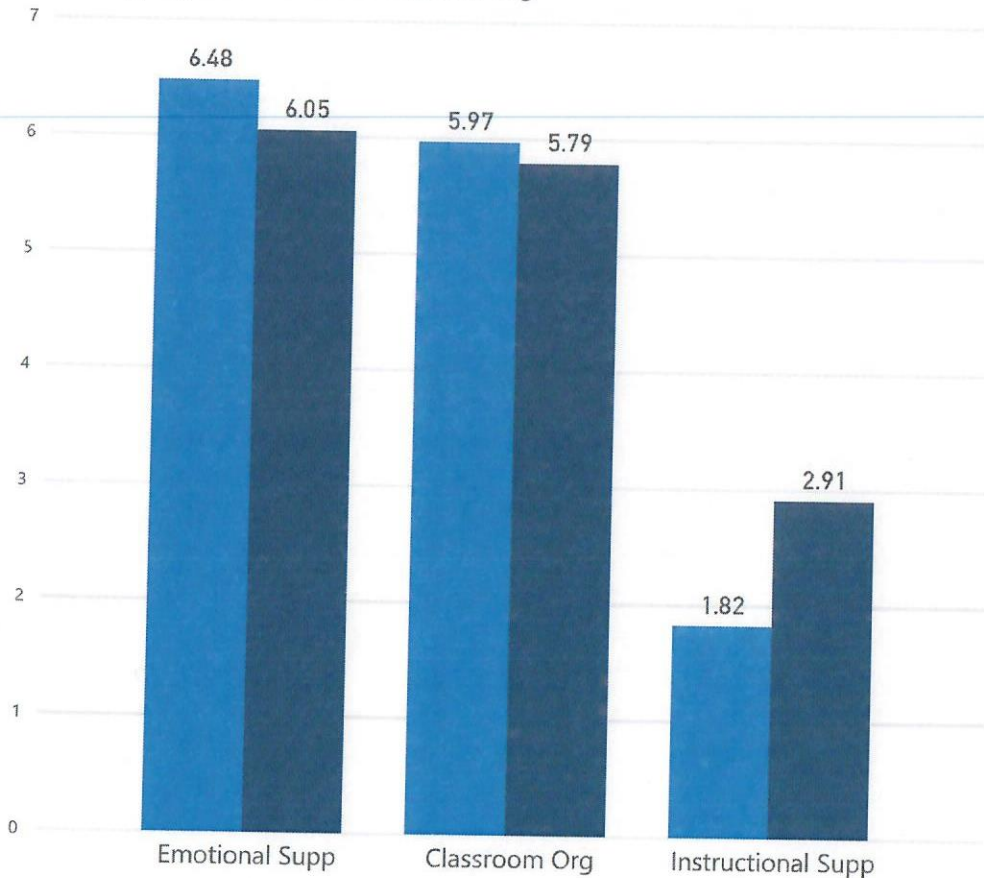

CLASS SCORES

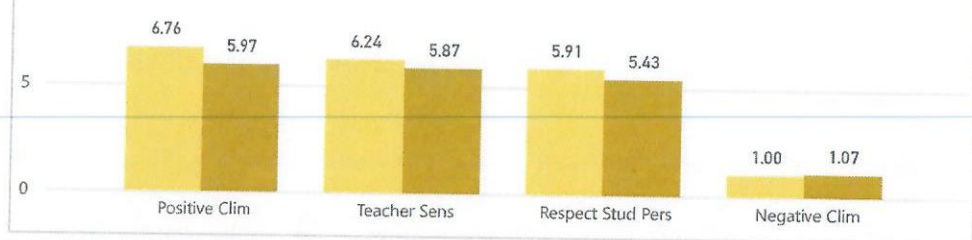
CSA AGGREGATE CLASS SCORES - FALL 2019

● CSA Aggregate Score ● 2019 National Avg



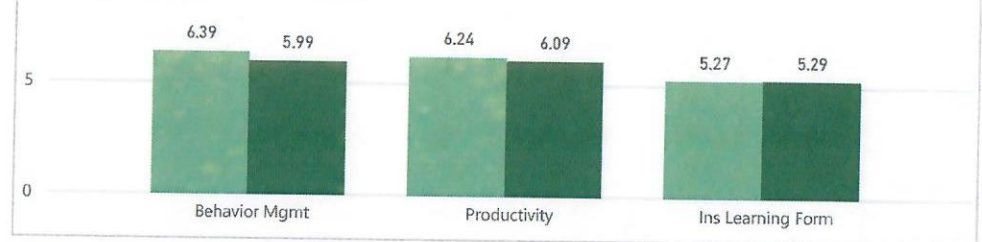
EMOTIONAL SUPPORT by DIMENSION

We have a variety of parent trainings: Healthy Crockpot Cooking, Conscious Discipline, Little Cooks & Little Books, Ready Rosie, and CPR just to name a few.

In March family engagement looked slightly different and we worked with the families on how to engage their child in learning at home. We sent learning materials home and supported family engagement in a whole new way!
